

This Week in Labor History:

On March 10th, 1919, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its decision in *Debs v. United States*, affirming the prosecution and jailing of labor leader Eugene Debs under the Espionage Act of 1919. The case stemmed from Debs' arrest the previous year for a speech he gave in Canton, Ohio, in opposition to U.S. participation in World War I. In 1920, Debs ran for president from prison, garnering nearly a million votes.
