Did you know?

- Wondering about how your final retirement compensation is calculated? For most faculty, this number is based on the highest average annual compensation you earned in any period of 36 consecutive months. It is not necessarily based on your final 3 years of work, but in many cases that period coincided with your highest earnings. (Exception: The calculation for faculty hired under the 2% at 60 formula who also have 25 or more years of service credit is based on an average of the highest 12 consecutive months.)
