Organizing: “Pack the House!” - The Board of Trustees Meeting is Wednesday and here's what we NEED FROM YOU!

- Come to the “Pack the House” Rally - Join us in T-1200 starting at 3:30. We will hear from speakers, make signs, distribute stickers and buttons, and most importantly let the Trustees know that we are there to demand a fair and equitable contract. We understand that most people will not be able to attend the whole time. ***Please come when you can and stay as long as you can.*** Open session for the meeting starts at 5:30. Bring your students, your family, your neighbors, and your friends.

- Attend the Social Justice Block Party, 12-3pm in the A quad and bring your students!
- Volunteer to table at the Social Justice Block Party and to help at the rally. Email Vanessa if you're available and interested.
- ***If you can't attend the rally and the Board Meeting, you can still show your support. Send a picture of yourself in your red shirt or holding a sign of support to Vanessa by 5pm, 10/17. You can also send a message of support for a fair and equitable contract if you aren't comfortable sending a picture.***
- ***Thank you to everyone who has worked hard to get us to this point, especially our negotiations team! Let's use this opportunity to show the Board that we are powerful together! When you invest in faculty, you invest in students!***

Negotiations:

- The FA's Negotiation Team met with the district on October 12. The District once again presented the same salary proposal we rejected and made a counterproposal of Year 1: COLA (8.22%) Year 2: COLA (3.54%*), Year 3: COLA (3.34%*projected). The district offer on full lecture lab parity is still pending the confirmation that the College is funded by the State for the full rate. A full negotiation update will be sent later today.

- If you believe that we deserve fully funded COLA for all three years and lecture lab parity, you need to show up on 10/18 and make your voice heard! Let's **Pack the House!!!** See the Organizing message above for specific details.

Newly Tenured:

- When do you have to participate in your first Tenured Evaluation?
 - Article 9.5.1.2 When a probationary faculty member becomes a tenured faculty member at the conclusion of the probationary period, that faculty member will be scheduled for the next regular **evaluation in the third full year following the probationary period.**

Tenure Committee Information:

- Article 9.5.1.1 Tenured faculty members shall be evaluated at least once in every three (3) years.

Contract:

- **10.3.6** Faculty members shall not be given mandatory Saturday and/or Sunday regular load assignments unless the District has informed both LBCCFA and the affected faculty member in writing, setting forth the reasons for the assignment, and provided them an opportunity to review the situation and discuss it with the area dean or first line dean.

Wall 2 Wall (W2W) UPDATE(s):

- No update this week, group at work. Rest assured that part of this workgroup is to engage with faculty and no decisions or votes will be made until information from the workgroup and feedback from faculty occurs.
 - *Wall to wall refers to the merging of the Faculty Association Union with the CHI Union.
